Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment at the office of the County Clerk.

Those were present Commissioners John Deskinies Chairman John Walton and J. C. Walton and Deputy County Clerk Albert H. Brooks

On motion it was ordered by the Board that the said Mrs. Scott be allowed to redeem said lots from sale to the County upon the payment of the amounts for which said lots were sold and subsequent taxes assessed thereon without interest.
