Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment

Lydia A. Loomis having offered
to redeem the S. E. 1/4 of Sec. 14, T. 14 R. 17 from the sale of 1863
for the taxes of 1863. The certificate of said sale being held
by the County, by paying the amount for which said
land was sold and interest at the rate of ten per cent per
annum. It was ordered that the Treasurer allow the
said Lydia A. Loomis to redeem said land upon the
payment by her of the amount for which said land was
sold and interest thereon at the rate of ten per cent
per annum and costs of redemption.

In the matter of Petition of
S. S. Weatherby to purchase }
certain tax certificates } 3

P. T. Rhodes agent for S. S.
Weatherby made a statement that the said S. S. Weatherby
held certain tax certificates on lots 35, 37, 39, 41 and 43
Fremont Street, and on lots 38 and 40 Elm Street
in Baldwin City. Said certificates being illegal on acc-
ount of a former tax sale to the County, and offered
to redeem the lots from the sales of which he held the
certificates, by surrendering the certificates to the
County Treasurer, on condition that the County Board
would authorize the County Treasurer to assign the
certificates held by the County to him for one dollar
per lot, without interest or costs of assignment.
On motion the proposition was accepted and it was
ordered that the County Treasurer assign the certificates
held by the County on said lots to the said S. S. Weatherby
upon the payment by him of one dollar per lot, and
the surrender by him of the illegal certificates held by him
on said lots. the redemption and assignment certifi-
cates to be made without costs.
