

Lawrence, Kansas, April 15<sup>th</sup> 1880.

Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment at the office of the County Clerk.

There were present Commissioners John Beckins, Chairman, John Mullon and J. C. Walton and County Clerk M. J. Stone.

In the matter of the Petition of  
B. K. Mauley and others for the Vacation  
and Location of a Road.

The Petition of B. K. Mauley and others for the Vacation and Location of a road in Marion Township was taken up and considered by the Board and no legal objections having been offered against the establishment of the same and believing it to be of public utility, it was ordered, that the Viewers report and view and report and plat of survey be adopted, and that said road be declared located and established as a public highway in accordance therewith; full record thereof to be made in the County Road Record; and the Trustee of Marion Township be notified to cause the same to be opened for the public travel.

It is further ordered that a warrant be issued to F. M. Jenkins for Ninety Seven Dollars (\$97.00) in full compensation for all damages occasioned by the location and establishment of said road.

Thomas McCall, Trustee of Willow Springs Township appeared and made report of the business of said Willow Springs Township for the year ending January 31<sup>st</sup> 1880, which report was read and approved.

In the matter of Treasury Examiner

Francis Menet and A. J. Bicker were appointed by the Board to assist the Probate Judge in the examination of the accounts of the County Treasurer for the Quarter ending June 30<sup>th</sup> 1880.

In the matter of the Petition of  
H. C. Howard and others for the  
Location of a road.

The Board of County Commissioners having under consideration the aforesaid road and no legal objection having been offered against the establishment of the same and believing it to be of public utility, it was ordered, that the Viewers report and view and report and plat of survey be adopted, and that said road be declared located and established as a public highway in accordance therewith; full record thereof to be made in the County Road Record; and the Trustee of Palmyra Township be notified to cause the same to be opened for the public travel.

It is further ordered that a warrant be issued to Joseph Charles Giffelt for Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) in full compensation for all damages occasioned by the location and establishment
