{ On the 14th day of April, 1880, a Road Petition was filed signed by William Ruffert^{and} 15 others and presented to the Board praying for the Location of a Road described as follows: Begin at the N.W. corner of the N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 5, Town 12, Range 20, and run thence South one mile to the S.W. cor. of the S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 5, T. 12, R. 20. Said Petition was accompanied with bond as required by law signed by William Ruffert as principal and Wm Weidemann as surety in the sum of Fifty Dollars, which bond was approved and it appearing to the
