The Board of County Commissioners, having under consideration the aforesaid road ^{and} no legal objections having been offered against the establishment of the same, and believing it to be of public utility, it was ordered that the Viewers report ^{as} view ^{and} report ^{as} plat of survey be adopted, and that said road be declared located ^{as} established as a public highway in accordance therewith, full record thereof to be made in the County Road Record; and the Trustee of Palmyra Township be notified to cause the same to be opened for the public travel.

It is further ordered that warrants be issued to J.P. Wassen for \$40⁰⁰ to Charles Galletly for \$35⁰⁰ ^{and} to S.A. Stonebraker for \$35⁰⁰, in full compensation for all damages occasioned by the location ^{and} establishment of said road.

Board adjourned to meet April 17th 1880, at 9 o'clock A.M.
