

In the matter of the Petition of
James Tegart ^{and} others for
the Location of a Road.

On the 19th day of March 1880, a Road
Petition was filed signed by James Tegart ^{and} 18 others ^{and} presented to
the Board of County Commissioners praying for the Location of a
Road described as follows: Begin at the center of the South line
of Sec. 8, Town 13, Range 18, running thence South to the center of
Sec. 17, on 1/4 Sec. line or as near as practicable thereto.

Said Petition was accompanied with bond as required by law
signed by James Tegart as principal ^{and} Peter Salvenda ^{and} George
Gress as sureties in the sum of One Hundred Dollars, which bond
was approved, ^{and} it appearing to the Board that the law had been
substantially complied with, it was ordered that James H. Dean
Henry Heine ^{and} J. C. Brown be appointed Viewers of the said road
and that upon the day named in their notice together with the
County Surveyor they proceed to view ^{and} lay out said road according
to law, giving to all parties a hearing ^{and} make due report of their
proceedings to this Board.

In the matter of the sale of the
County's Interest in Lots in
Baldwin City to J. M. Sullivan.

A petition filed April 19th 1880, and signed
by J. M. Sullivan, praying for permission to take an assignment
of tax certificates held by Douglas County on Lots G. H. D. J. K. L. on Grove
Street ^{and} R. on High Street, all in Baldwin City, for the sale of 1867.
tax of 1868, in consideration of the payment of 25 per cent. of the
original amount for which said Lots were sold ^{and} the surrender
for cancellation of Illegal Certificates on same Lots of the sale of
1872. tax of 1871, on which is endorsed the tax of 1872, was accepted.
