John E. Rake and others for the
Change of a Road.

On the 12th day of April 1880, a Road Petition was filed signed by John E. Rake and 16, others and presented to the Board of Commissioners praying for the Change of a road described as follows:

Begin at a point about 20 Rods West of the S.W. Cor. of the S.W.¹/₄ Sec. 29, Town 12, Range 18, and terminate about 60 rods East of said corner, and to vacate the road as now laid out and to locate the same on the Sec. line between the aforementioned points.

Said petition was accompanied with bond as required by law signed by J. E. Rake as principal and Isaac Stull as surety, in the sum of Fifty Dollars, which bond was approved and it appearing to the Board that the law had been substantially complied with, it was ordered that A. W. Buck, John Hour and J. E. Vincent be appointed viewers of the said road and that upon the day named in their notice together with the County Surveyor they proceed to view said road according to law giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to this Board.

In the matter of the Petition of
Wm Smith and others for the
Location of a Road.

On the 1st day of April 1880, a Road Petition was filed signed by Wm Smith and 42, others and presented to the Board of Commissioners praying for the Location of a road described as follows:

Beginning at the S.E. cor. of the S.W.¹/₄ of Sec. 23, Town 14, Range 18, running thence on a line North as near as practicable to the North West corner of the S.¹/₂ of the N.E.¹/₄ of Sec. 14, Town 14, Range 18. Thence East 40 rods, to intersect a road running down Washington Creek Valley.

Said petition was accompanied with bond as required by law signed by Wm Smith as principal and Wm Fiepel and James Tally as sureties in the sum of all costs and expenses accruing on said laying out &c. which bond was approved and it appearing to the Board that the law had been substantially complied with it was ordered that S. Bland, R. Kelley and Wm Schoeflin be
