

Lawrence, Kansas, June 14th 1880.

Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment at the office of the County Clerk.

There were present Commissioners John Deskins, Chairman, John Walton and J. C. Walton and County Clerk, H. O. Stevens.

The Board took up for consideration the assessment rolls as returned by the Township Assessors for the year 1880.

The Board reported to the County Clerk that the Bridge over the Kansas River at Lawrence had been tested and accepted and the Clerk was instructed to issue scrip to Insley, Shire & Co. Proprietors of the Mo. Valley Bridge and Iron Works, for \$8590⁰⁰ payable one half Jan'y, 1st 1881, and one half July, 1st 1881.

Board adjourned to meet June 15th 1880, at 9 o'clock a.m.
