

Conc John Walton moved that the land assessment of Douglas County be equalized as follows: Wakarusa \$11²⁵, Grant, \$1²⁵, Leavenworth, \$4⁰⁰; Kawartha, \$4⁵⁰; Clinton, \$4⁵⁰; Marion, \$3⁵⁰; Willow Springs, \$4⁵⁰; Palmyra, \$5⁰⁰; Eudora, \$5⁰⁰. City to remain as assessed. On call of roll on the above motion the gentlemen voted as follows: John Beckines, No; John Walton, Aye; J. C. Walton, Aye. Carried.

John Walton moved that 10% be added to the valuation of horses in Leavenworth Township - Carried.

John Walton moved that 15% be added to the valuation of horses in Clinton Township. Carried.

John Walton moved that 10% be added to the valuation of horses in Willow Springs Township. Carried.

John Walton moved that 15% be deducted from the valuation of horses in Eudora Township. Carried.

John Beckines moved that no change be made in the assessed valuation of cattle in the County. Lost.

John Walton moved that 15% be taken from the valuation of cattle in Eudora ^{and} Palmyra Townships ^{any} 10% from cattle in Wakarusa. Carried.

John Beckines moved that the valuation of corn remain unchanged. Lost.

J. C. Walton moved that the valuation of corn in Marion be raised 2 cents per bushel. Carried.

John Walton moved that the valuation of corn in Willow Springs Township be raised 1½ cents per bushel. Carried.

Board adjourned June 10th.
