Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment at the office of the County Clerk.

There were present Commissioners John Westmore, Chairman, John Walton ^{and} J.C. Walton ^{and} County Clerk, H.O. Stevens.

In the matter of the Petition of {

Location of a Road. } The Board of County Commissioners having under consideration the aforesaid road ^{and} no legal objections having been offered against the establishment of the same ^{and} believing it to be of public utility, it was ordered that the Viewers report and view ^{any} report ^{and} plat of survey be adopted; ^{and} that said road be declared located ^{and} established as a public highway in accordance therewith; full record thereof to be made in the County Road Record; and the Trustee of Eudora Township be notified to cause the same to be opened for the Public travel.

It is further ordered that a warrant be issued to R. C. Johnston for Thirty Dollars (\$30⁰⁰) in full compensation for all damages occasioned by the location ^{and} establishment of said road.
