

Lawrence, Kansas, August 2nd 1880.

Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to Law at the office of the County Clerk.

There were present Commissioners John Deskinen, Chairman, John Walton and J. C. Walton and County Clerk W. O. Stevens.

In the matter of Tax Levy }
for the year 1880.

The Board of County Commissioners having under consideration the matter of Tax Levies for various purposes for the year 1880. The following levies were agreed upon and ordered:

For General Fund 8 1/2 mills; For State 5 1/2 mills; For Bridge Fund 2 mills; For Bridge Repair 1/2 mill; For interest on Bonds 5 mills. On Township recommendations, Wacarusa 1 mill, Kanawaka, 2 mills; Clinton, 10 mills for Interest and 1 mill for General Fund, Main, 1 mill; Willow Springs, 1 mill; Palmyra, 2 mills.

The following petition of Caroline Reynolds, by Noyes and Gleason, Agts. was considered and Granted:

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners in and for Douglas County, State of Kansas:

Your Petitioner, Caroline Reynolds, would respectfully represent that she is the owner of Lot No. 122, in Townsecr Street, that by the Records it appears that said lot was sold to the County Sept 14th 1859, for \$21.25 Amount of Taxes and expenses for 1858, and still remains in said County, not transferred, That although said tax and sale are of no legal validity, being previous to a Patent being issued from the Government, it is still a cloud upon the title to said lot.

Your Petitioner therefore prays your Honorable Board to grant an order to clear said record from said tax claims, upon payment to the Treasurer of said County the amount of said sale, and the expense of redemption.

And, as in duty bound will ever pray.
