Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to Law at the office of the County Clerk.

There were present Commissioners John Beckins, Chairman, John Walter ^{and} J.C. Weller ^{and} County Clerk N.O. Stevens.

In the matter of Tax Levy }

for the year 1880. } The Board of County Commissioners having under consideration the matter of Tax Levs for various purposes for the year 1880. The following levys were agreed upon ^{and} ordered:

For General Fund 8½ mills; For State 5½ mills; For Bridge Fund 2 mills, for Bridge Repairs ½ mill. For interest on Bonds 5 mills. On Township recommendations, Wakarusa 1 mill, Kauwaka, 2 mills; Clinton, 10 mills for Interest ^{and} 1 mill for General Fund. Marion, 1 mill; Willow Springs, 1 mill; Patwyna, 2 mills.

The following petition of Caroline Reynolds, by Noyes ^{and} Gleason, Agt, was considered ^{and} Granted:

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners in ^{and} for Douglas County, State of Kansas.

Your Petitioner, Caroline Reynolds, would respectfully represent that she is the owner of lot No. 122, in Tennessee Street, that by the Records it appears that said lot was sold to the County Sept 14th 1857, for \$28⁵⁰. Amount of Taxes ^{and} expenses for 1858, ^{and} still remains in said County, not transferred, that although said tax ^{and} sale are of no legal validity, being previous to a Patent being issued from the Government, it is still a cloud upon the title to said lot.

Your Petitioner thereon prays your Honorable Board to grant an order to clear said record from said tax claim, upon payment to the Treasurer of said County the amount of said sale, and the expense of redemption.
