None of them save yourself, would take bonds. We consider the charge made by Mr. Clarke as not only untrue but one he ought to have known to be false.

The Board have worked long^{and} hard to effect these settlements, and to be charged either directly or indirectly with dishonesty in the matter, is unjust in the last degree.

The Board of County Commissioners having under consideration the aforesaid road^{and} no legal objections having been offered against the establishment of the same and believing it to be of public utility, it was ordered that the Viewers Report^{and} view^{and} report^{and} plot of survey be adopted and that said road be declared located^{and} established in accordance therewith; full record thereof to be made in the County road record and the Trustees of Clinton Township be notified to cause the same to be opened for the public travel. Provided, that R. A. Steele, the person claiming damage accept from the County fifty Dollars in full compensation for all damages occasioned by the location^{and} establishment of said road.
