In the matter of the transfer of the surplus money in the County Interest Fund to create a Sinking Fund.

The following order by direction of the Board was transmitted to the County Treasurer:

To Oliver Barber, County Treasurer of Douglas County: You are hereby directed^{and} empowered to transfer from the Interest Fund to a fund to be styled the "Sinking Fund", Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) by an Act of the Legislature approved February 26th 1881.

It was further ordered that the County Clerk be directed to draw an order in favor of G. H. E. Griffith, for (\$10,143.³⁴) in payment for Bonds numbered as follows: Nos 110, 111, 112, 113, 114, 115, 116, 117, 118, ^{and} 119. Principal \$10,000.⁰⁰. Interest 2 ³/₈ months \$143.³⁴.
