The Location of a Road.

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of January 1882, a road petition was filed signed by Geo J. Sperry and 11 others and presented to the Board of Commissioners praying for the location of a public-private road described as follows: Beginning at the N.E. cor. of the 5<sup>th</sup> or the S.W. 1/4 of Sec. 6, T.13, R.21, running thence W. 1/4 mile to the Sec. line between Sec. 1 T.13, R.20, and Sec. 6, T.13, R.21. Said petition was accompanied with bond as required by law signed by Geo J. Sperry as principal in the sum of One Thousand Dollars, which bond was affirmed and it appearing to the Board that the law had been substantially complied with. It was ordered that Shad Whedon, W. L. Suttle and J. B. Smith be appointed Surveyors of the said road and that upon the day named in their notice together with the County Surveyor they proceed to view and lay out said road according to law giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to this Board.
