

Linn, Kansas, January 4th 1882.

Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment at the office of the County Clerk.

There were present Commissioners J. H. Walton Chairman John Walton and P. A. Kolba and County Clerk W. O. Gleason.

The Board had under consideration disputed tax matters.

In the matter of the Dedication of land for a County Road by Jacob Markey and others.

Jacob Markey, Stephen Studenaker, J. H. Truse and Louis Churchbaugh owners of the land on the South side of Sec. 4, and the North side of Sec. 9, T. 14, R. 19, having on July 7th 1881, filed with the County Clerk and presented to the Board of Commissioners an agreement to dedicate a public road from the west side of said Secs east on the line between said Secs to the School house in the N.E. cor. of Sec. 9. It was ordered by the Board that the road so dedicated be accepted and opened for the public use.

J. H. Truse and Louis Churchbaugh owners of the land on the South side of Sec. 4, and the North side of Sec. 9, T. 14, R. 19, having on July 7th 1881, filed with the County Clerk and presented to the Board of Commissioners an agreement to dedicate a public road from the west side of said Secs east on the line between said Secs to the School house in the N.E. cor. of Sec. 9. It was ordered by the Board that the road so dedicated be accepted and opened for the public use.
