

Laurance, Kansas, January 6th 1882.

Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment at the office of County Clerk.

There were present Commissioners J. C. Walton, Chairman, John Walton and P. A. Kotter and County Clerk W. J. Starnes.

In the matter of the Petition of
A. S. Baldwin and others for the
Location of a Road.

On the 6th day of January 1882 a road petition was filed signed by A. S. Baldwin and 31 others and presented to the Board of Commissioners praying for the location of a road described as follows: Commencing at the center of Sec. 14, T. 13, R. 15, Thru S. along center line of Sec. 16, 21, and 28, to the Laurance and Emporia State Road about 1³/₄ miles. Said petition was accompanied with bond as required by law signed by J. J. Stule as principal and J. E. McCoy and J. E. Moon as sureties, in the sum of One Hundred Dollars, which bond was approved and it appearing to the Board that the law had been substantially complied with it was ordered That S. A. Waldern, James Eggert and J. B. Petefish be appointed Viewers of the said road and that upon the day named in their notice together with the County Surveyor they proceed to view and lay out said according to law giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to this Board.

The Board had under consideration the petition of Mrs. Chockley et al for a re-view and re-establishment of a road in Willow Springs Township.

Bond Comfirmise { The following resolution was considered and adopted by the Board:

Resolved - That the Chairman of the Board and County Clerk be authorized to issue County Scrip payable from the County Sinking Fund for the purpose of purchasing County Bonds.
