

Laurens, Kansas, January 11th 1882.

Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment at the office of the County Clerk.

There were present Commissioners J. C. Walton, Chairman, John Walton and P. W. Bolton and County Clerk W. O. Glessner.

The following resolution was considered and adopted by the Board:

Whereas, It appearing that an omission has been made to enter upon record the levy of taxes for the year 1881, upon certain Township, City and School District certificates and recommendations made the 3rd day of August A.D. 1881, by this Board.

Resolved That the County Clerk be instructed to enter now as of that time upon record the action of this Board upon said day in reference thereto.

The Board of Commissioners had under consideration accounts against the County.

In the matter of the Petition of Louis Lammertson for the Location of a Road.

The Board of County Commissioners having under consideration the aforesaid road and no legal objections having been offered against the establishment of the same and believing it to be of public utility. It was ordered that the Viewers report and View and report and plat of survey be adopted and the said road be declared located and established in accordance therewith full record thereof to be made in the County Road Record and the Trustee of Eudora Township be notified to cause the same to be opened for public travel. Provided however that Jacob Schiele the person claiming damages accept Twenty Five Dollars in full compensation for all damages occasioned by the location and establishment of said Road. Damages accepted.

The following resolution was adopted by the Board:

Resolved That the Chairman of the Board and the County Clerk be instructed to issue scope for amount of contract for the following County Bridges when said Bridges are completed and accepted: Two Bridges in Leavenworth Township. One in Eudora Tp and One in Leiden Tp and one Shaw Lawrence Bridge

It was ordered by the Board that an appropriation of \$750 (or an amount sufficient for the purpose) be made to purchase timbers for posts for Lawrence Bridge and for excavation at Poor Lane Bridge
