

In the matter of the petition of
Albert Bell et al for the Location
of a road.

{ On the 14th day of April 1882, a road petition was
filed signed by Albert Bell and 28 others and presented to the Board of Co
Commissioners praying for the Location of a County road described as
follows: Beginning at the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. between Secs 29 and 23, Township 14, R. 19,
th N. on $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. line to Center of Sec. 17, T. 14, R. 19, th on most practicable route
to N. W. cor. of Sec 8, T. 14, R. 19. Said petition was accompanied with bond as
required by law signed by Albert Bell as principal and W. A. Marshall
as surety in the sum of costs and expenses, which bond was approved
and it appearing to the Board that the law had been substantially
complied with It was ordered That C. J. Bliss Henry Webster and Geo Haas
be appointed Viewers of the said road and that upon the day named
in their notice together with the County Surveyor they proceed to view and
lay out said road giving to all parties a hearing and make due
report of their proceedings to this Board.

The Board had under consideration accounts against the County
Board adjourned Sine Die
