

Whereas, A petition numerously signed by the tax payers of Douglas County has this day been presented to the Board of County Commissioners recommending the taking of such action as will secure the refunding of outstanding County Bonds at 60 cents on the dollar and

Whereas, The Board after due deliberation and being in full accord with the sentiment of the aforesaid petition feeling that the best interests of the County will be subserved in the offering of some new indentment to the holders of our County Bonds to present the same for refunding. Therefore be it Resolved, That outstanding unrefunded, Douglas County, railroad Bonds which the same are presented to the Board on or before July 1st 1882, in amounts (principal and interest) not less than \$100,000⁰⁰ be refunded at the rate of 60^{cts} on the dollar.
