In matter of Petition of P. A. Dolbee
for dedication of Road by S. O. Thacher
and Forest Savage

{ The Board having under consideration the aforesaid Petition filed April 7th 1882, It was ordered That said dedication be accepted in accordance with plat and field notes of Surveyor.

In the matter of the Petition of
James Fitzpatrick et al for the
Location of a road

{ The Board having under consideration the aforesaid road and no legal objections having been offered against the establishment of the same and believing it to be of public utility It was ordered That the Viewers report and view and report and plat of survey be adopted and the said road be declared located and established in accordance therewith full road there to be made in the County Road Record and the Trustee of Leecompton Township be notified to cause the same to be opened for the public travel. It was further ordered That the County Clerk be instructed to issue County scrip in the amount of \$20⁰⁰ in favor of H. Kersting in full compensation for all damages occasioned by the location and establishment of said road.

Proposition of

James Brooks. { The Board having under consideration the aforesaid proposition It was ordered That the County Treasurer be instructed to assign to James Brooks Tax Certificates No^s 1343, Sale 1867, Cert No. 770, Sale 1880, being Lot 9, Block 23, Clinton, for one dollar each and the surrender of all outstanding individual certificates against said Lot.

Proposition of

J. M. Sullivan. { The Board having under consideration the aforesaid proposition It was ordered That the County Treasurer be instructed to assign to J. M. Sullivan the County's interest in Lots 144, on Jersey St, Lots 133 and 135, on King Street for one dollar per lot and Lots 114, 116, 118 and 120, on King Street for two dollars per lot, all in Baldwin City, without cost of transfer.
