

\$25⁰⁰ in favor of John Glass in full compensation for all damages occasioned by the location and establishment of said Road.

In the matter of the petition of John F. Weaver and others for the Location and Vacation of a Road.

On the 5th day of January 1884, a Road petition was filed signed by John F. Weaver, and 18 others and presented to the Board of Commissioners praying for the Location and Vacation of a County Road described as follows: Locate - commencing at a point about 30 Rods N. of the County line between Douglas and Johnson Counties in the SE^{1/4} of the NE^{1/4} of Section 34, Township 12 Range 21, in Douglas County running thence N.E. to the County line aforesaid on the South side of A.T. & S.F. R.R. Vacate - That part of said Road that now crosses the A.T. & S.F. R.R. diagonally in the SE^{1/4} of the NE^{1/4} of Section 34, T. 12, R. 21, running in a Northeastly direction to the Johnson County line. Said petition was accompanied with bond as required by law signed by John F. Weaver as principal in the sum of One Hundred Dollars, which bond was approved and it appearing to the Board that the law had been substantially complied with it was ordered That Joseph West, J. R. Allen and C. A. James be appointed Viewers of the said Road and that upon the day named in their notice together with the County Surveyor they proceed to View and lay out said Road according to law giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to this Board.

Board adjourned to meet January 10th 1884, at 9 o'clock A.M.
