

Laurens, Kansas, January 14<sup>th</sup> 1884.

Board of County Commis met pursuant to adjournment at the office of the County Clerk.

There were present Comis J. C. Walton Chairman, John Walton and P. A. Dolbee and County Clerk H. O. Stevens.

Comis Dolbee submitted the following Resolution and moved it -

Whereas, an examination of the population of the various commissioner Districts of Douglas County, discloses the fact that the first District contains a population nearly equal to both the 2<sup>d</sup> and the 3<sup>d</sup>.

Whereas, The law makes it the duty of the Board of County Commis to re-district the County once in every three years. Therefore be it

Resolved, That the County of Douglas, be re-districted for the purpose of Commissioner Representation as follows:

First Dist. The 1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>d</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> wards of the City of Laurens and Grant Township.

Second Dist. The 3<sup>d</sup> ward of the City of Laurens, and Wakarusa and Eudora Townships.

Third Dist. Leecompton, Kanawaka, Clinton, Marion, Willow Springs and Palmyra Townships.

The Board proceeded to discuss the motion of Comis Dolbee and Comis John Walton moved an adjournment. At this point Comis elect Wm. Hooper appeared and claimed his seat upon the Board the hour being after midnight. After further discussion the Board adjourned to meet at 1 1/2 o'clock P.M.
