The Board having under consideration bids for Poor Farm - the following bid was in motion accepted, and Mr. John E. Dodge declared elected Superintendent of County Farm and Poor Farm for the ensuing year.

To the Honorable County Commissioners
of Douglas County, Kansas.

Sir:

I will make the following bid and will conserve and care for the the Poor Farm and the Parkers now there and that may be placed on the said farm in said County as required by Law for the year commencing March 1. 1884. and ending March 1. 1885. I will do for the sum of Three Hundred dollars, and will include in this bid the necessary repairs on said farm and the blacksmithing for the same money \$300. That may be required, and haul out all the manure from the farm - and will haul in addition from the City of Lancaster and place on said farm to its best advantage in addition all of which is included in this bid.
