Proposition of

The Board having under consideration the aforesaid proposition it was ordered that the County Treas. execute and the County Clerk assign the County's interest by reason of Tax Sale, to A. Zeisenis for the sum of five dollars, Lot No. 10, Block 71, Concord.

Sinclair the County's interest by reason of Tax Sale in Block 94, and in Lots 7, 8, 79 in Block No 95, Bloomington News for amount of original sale without interest or cost of transfer.

The Board having under consideration the aforesaid proposition it was ordered that the offer of Mr. S. Sinclair in the following proposition be and the same is hereby accepted.

"I offer to pay the sum of ten dollars for a release of lot No. 11, Rhode Island St. in the City of Lawrence from a judgment rendered in July 19, 1850 vs. Mrs. A. Lecher ad. Board of Commrs. of Douglas Co in Case No. 4739 in District Court."

M. M. Jenkins and 65 others

For the vacation of certain Streets

and alleys
in the Baldwin City

On the 9th day of July 1854, a petition signed by M. M. Jenkins and 65 others, was filed and presented to the Board of County Commissioners, praying for the vacation of Streets and Alleys in the City of Baldwin as follows: "From Orange St and including Missouri Street and from 1st to 3rd Street in said Baldwin City" The Board having the same under consideration and believing it to be for the best interest of the Public. It was ordered, that the petition be granted as prayed for and that the vacation be ordered in accordance therewith.
