

In the matter of
 Petition M. Armstrong & others
 for location of a road

On the 9th of Oct. A.D. 1883 a road petition signed by
 M. Armstrong and others was presented to the County Commissioners praying
 for a road as follows -

Beginning at the 4th sec corner between sections 6 & 7 T. 13 R. 20 thence S on
 sec. line 80 rods to the Indian School lands

Upon due consideration, no legal objections having been offered against
 the establishment of said road, and believing the same to be of public utility,
 it is Ordered: that the Viewers report of view, and report and plat of survey
 be adopted, and that said road be declared located and established as a
 public highway in accordance therewith, except that part from the north side
 of Indian School lands south, ^{which is the 2^d Sec. of the 1st 1/2 of 1876 of sec. 7, T. 13, R. 20.} full record thereof ^{to be} made in the
 County Road Record and plat at Road No. 414. and the Trustee of
 Makarsa Township be notified to cause the same to be opened
 for the public travel.

It is further Ordered, that scrip be issued to the following
 named persons for amount stated in full compensation for all
 damages occasioned by the location and establishment of
 said road - to wit O.E. Leonard \$125⁰⁰ & M. Brown Agt. \$125⁰⁰

Board adjourned to meet Jan'y 9 A.D. 1885 at 9 oc. am.
