

Laurie House, March 7, 1885.

Board of County Commissioners met in special session at the
office of the County Clerk

There were present Commissioners John Hatten, Thomas
H. Draper and J. E. McCoy and County Clerk J. S. White.

In the matter of the
Road Cases appeared to
Supreme Court.

Verbal agreement was made with James Green to
act as attorney for the County in this case and the sum of one hundred
dollars (\$100⁰⁰) as compensation therefor was agreed upon.

In the matter of
James Sykes

Saturday next the 14th inst. was the day fixed upon
for a hearing on the petition of a number of citizens for the removal of
said James Sykes from lands (belonging to the County Poor Farm)
The County Clerk was directed to notify said James Sykes of this action.

Appointment

It was ordered that J. E. McCoy be and he is appointed
on behalf of the County to attend to and look after its interest in cases
now pending in the Court in which the County is interested.

In the matter of an open
account vs. Robt. Morrow on
the Books of the County Clerk

Referring to action of Dist. Court May 8, 1879 in case of Board
of County Commissioners vs. J. H. Brigg, Robt. Young, James C. Watson and Robt. Morrow & Sons.
The Court ordered that Robert Morrow & Co. should be required to pay to the Clerk
of said Court certain money received for the redemptions from certain tax sales
mentioned in a certain petition. Now, therefore, it appearing to the satisfaction
of the County Commissioners that the said Robert Morrow did pay into said Court
the amount claimed \$674⁶⁰ that this amount be credited on the books
of the County Clerk and the said Robert Morrow's account be balanced.
