Refunded }

Mr. S. M. Curdy filed a bill of \$57.¹⁹ for illegal taxes which was carefully considered, and ordered that the Treasurer execute and the County Clerk transfer Tax Certificates three years old or more to Mr. S. M. Curdy for amount of original bills and 10% interest, in payment of said bill. It was further ordered that Mr. S. M. Curdy be permitted to redeem instead of taking a transfer if he preferred on same conditions as above. It was further ordered that the County Clerk issue County Scrip in payment for said bill of \$57.¹⁹
