

Laurance Kaw. July 11 1885.

In the Matter of the Petition of
Hiram Gibbons and others to
Locate & Vacate a Road

On the 4th day of May 1885. a said petition was filed
signed by Hiram Gibbons and others and presented to the Board of County Com.
of Douglas Co. Kaw. Praying for the location and vacating of a certain road described
as follows, to wit:

"We the undersigned householders of said County respectfully
ask and petition that you cause to be vacated and make an alteration in
a road in said County, as follows:

Beginning at a stake 40 rods east of the S.E. corner of the S.W. 1/4
sec. 31. 11. 18. Known as the S.E. corner of 10 acres belonging to John Brown, thence
west 40 rods, on the North line of the S.W. 1/4 of sec. 31. 11. 18. to corner stone of the
S.E. 1/4 of the S.W. 1/4 of sec. 31. 11. 18. Hence north about 100 rods where intersects the
old road starting at the S.E. corner of the S.W. 1/4 of sec. 31. 11. 18. running North.
He ask the vacating of said old road - that portion running through the
S.E. 1/4 of the S.W. 1/4 of sec. 31. 11. 18. Known as the Gibbons 40 acres. The location
for the new road runs through lands owned by persons who consent to
the proposed change without charge."

Said petition was accompanied with bond as required by law, signed
by Hiram Gibbons as principal, and Jas. A. Davidson and J. D. McCallum
as sureties in the sum of all costs and expenses occurring on the
view. Whereupon, said bond was approved by the Board, and it
appearing to the Board, that the law had been substantially complied with,
it was ordered, that Mr. Brass, R. J. Richards and Mr. George - be
appointed viewers of said road, and upon the day named in their
notice in conjunction with the County Surveyor they proceed to view, locate
and vacate said road according to law, giving to all parties a
hearing and make due report of their proceedings to this Board.

Board had under consideration claims to the County.

Board adjourned to meet July 18th, 1885
