

Lawrence Kans. July 13, 1885.

The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment at the office of the County Clerk

and were present Commissioners John Mutton, Chairman Mr Draper and J. B. McCoy and County Clerk Joel S. White

In the matter of the petition
of H. Ketele and others for
location of a road with
proof of petition attached

On the 13th day of July A.D. 1885. a road petition was filed signed by H. Ketele and others and presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kans. praying for the location of a certain road described as follows, to wit:

Beginning just north of Clinton Station on the Carbonate Branch of the U.P. Railroad on section line between sections 14 & 15 Township 13. N. 18. East. Thence North to the North East and North West corner of said sections thence crossing the Kansas River at the most practicable point within 300 feet of said corner. Thence West as near as practicable on the line between sections 10 and 11. About 4/5 of a mile. Thence West about 4 miles to intersect the Leecompton and Clinton road - or if in the judgment of the viewers it is more practicable to locate said road on the North Side of said Kansas River, commencing at the above named crossing of said river. Thence West as near as practicable along the North bank of said river to intersect the said Leecompton and Clinton road at or near the Rauzon or Bailey ford of said road

Said petition was accompanied with bond as required by law signed by H. Ketele as principal and W. J. Cunningham & M. Woodward as sureties in the penal sum of all costs and expenses attending said view.

Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with, it was ordered that O. P. Kennedy, H. H. Armstrong, and S. A. Haldeman be appointed viewers of said road, and upon the day named in their notice in conjunction with the County Surveyor. They proceeded to view and locate said road according to law giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to this Board.

Board had under consideration claims as the County
