The Board ordered that the County Clerk instruct the Telephone Company to remove the telephone poles from the jail lots, at once.

The Board having under consideration the aforesaid road and no legal objections having been offered against the ^{that portion hereafter described} Establishment of ^{to wit: Beginning at St. M. Cr. Sec. 20, & 19, thence South on section line one mile} and declaring it to be of public utility.

It was ordered that the Viewers report of said road and report and plat of survey be adopted, and that said road be declared located and established as a public Highway in accordance therewith; full record thereof to be made in the County Road Record and Plat as Road No. 101 and the Trustees of Clinton Township be notified to cause the same to be opened for the public travel.

It is further ordered, that warrants be issued to E. J. Morton for \$75⁰⁰ and J. Tobler \$25⁰⁰ in full compensation for all damages occasioned by location and establishment of said road, to wit: "Beginning at St. M. Cr. Sec. 20, & 19, thence South on section line one mile."
