The Board having the aforesaid petition
under consideration and no legal objections having been offered
against the establishment of said road and believing it to be of public
utility, it was ordered, that the Vicar's report of view and
report and plat of survey be adopted, and that said road be located
located and established as a public highway in accordance therewith.
Full record thereof to be made in the County Road Record and
Plat as Road No. 425 and the Sheriff of Leecompton Township
be notified to cause the same to be opened for the public travel.
to wit: Locate, "Beginning at a point 10 chains east of center of
corner in sec. 31. T. 11 N. R. 18 thence east on the 4th sec. line 10 chains.
thence North on the 4th sec. line 23⁰⁰ chains to County Road"
Vacate, "Beginning in the 4th sec. line 10 chains east of center of 4th sec.
corner in sec. 31. T. 11. R. 18. thence angling through the E. 1/4 of S. 1/4 of said
Sec. 31 to the intersection with new road."

We the undersigned hereby petition you to vacate the following
described Streets and alleys, situated in the town of Clinton, County
of Douglas and State of Kansas: Having given notice of the same in a paper
of general circulation for four consecutive weeks as prescribed by Law:
Streets H. D. J. St. S. W. and St. from first Street to the north side of the townsite
all alleys in Block 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 from first Street to the north side of
the townsite. Signed, C. D. Williams, C. K. L. S. K. L. S. K. L. S. D. M. Wood."

Whereupon the Board ordered the prayer of the petitioners be granted. Except
the alley running North and South through Block No. 10 (10)
