On the 18th day of September 1885, a road petition signed by J. C. Moore and 20 others was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas praying for the location of a certain road described as follows.

Beginning at or near
 fifty feet of the South West Corner of the N. W. 1/4 of Sections 19. S. 13. R. 18 and running in an easterly direction on the most practicable route between the Carbonate March of the Union Pacific RR and the bluff on the North of it, about one and a half miles to the half section line running North and South through Section 20. S. 13. R. 18. thence, North along that line to the Clinton and Jasper State Road on Center of Section 17. S. 13. R. 18. and we respectfully represent that each of us is a Householder of said County residing in the vicinity where said road is proposed to be laid out and that said road if so laid out will be of public utility.

Said petition was accompanied with bond as required by law, signed by J. C. Moore as principal and J. R. Woodward and E. J. Woodward as sureties in the penal sum of all costs and expenses.

Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board, that the law had been substantially complied with, it was ordered that Geo. Petefish Samuel Allen & H. J. New Currier be appointed Viewers of the proposed road and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning on the day named in their notice and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law, giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to the County Board.
