In the Matter of Road
 Petitioned for by Joseph Fisher
 and others

On the 1st day of January 1886, a road petition signed by Joseph Fisher and 15 others was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas, praying for the establishment of a certain road, described as follows.

Beginning at the corner stone in the center of section 36, T. 11, R. 17, running thence south a distance of some 95 rods, thence in a southeasterly direction, upon the most practicable ground to the south line of said section, thence east along said line and outside of Mr. Mrs. Stoggs' stone fence to a point thereon, some 9 or ten rods west of the corner stone at the southeast corner of said section 36, and thence in a southeasterly direction, upon the most practicable ground to intersect the traveled road from Big Spring to Hampton.

Said petition was accompanied with bond as required by law, signed by Joseph Fisher as principal and W. H. Christian & J. A. Davidson as sureties in the penal sum of all costs and expenses.

Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board, that the law had been substantially complied with it was ordered that A. B. Beck, Frank Cress, and Carington Lake be appointed Viewers of the proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning on the day named in their notice, and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law, giving to all parties a hearing, and make due report of their proceedings to the Board of County Commissioners.
