

In the Matter of a road }
petitioned for by Morris Melsh }
and 41 others }

On the 16th day of March AD 1886, a road petition signed by Morris Melsh and 41 others was filed and presented to the Board this day praying for the location of a certain road described as follows.

Beginning at the South West Corner of Section 20 & 21, S 13. R 20 E. Thence due north on section line $3\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile, to intersect the County Road running East and West.

Said petition was accompanied with bond as required by law signed by Morris Melsh as principal and William Jones as security for the payment of all costs and expenses.

Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board, that the law had been substantially complied with, it was ordered that M. B. Kennedy J. J. McElroy & J. P. Harmon, be appointed viewers of the proposed road and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning on the day named in their notice, and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law, giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to the Board of County Commissioners.
