Canvas of Vote of
Special Election in
Palmyra & Willow Springs Twp.
June 29, ad 1886

The Board of County Commissioners
met as required by law as a Board of Canvassers at 10 o'clock
A.M. this 2^d day of July, ad 1886. for the purpose of canvassing the
vote of a Special Election heretofore ordered by the Board of County
Commissioners, to be held on the 29th day of June 1886, submitting
to the qualified Electors of Palmyra and Willow Springs Townships
in said County the proposition to vote Bonds to the Kansas, Colorado
and Texas Railroad Company to aid in the construction of a line
of Railroad which said Company proposes to build from Kansas
City, Missouri west and through said Townships.

The Board after having according to law duly canvassed
the vote of the Special Election and caused an abstract of the same
to be made on Page No. 475 of "Record of votes Cast" do find as
a result of said canvass that there were cast in said Townships
as follows. Palmyra Twp. For the Railroad Stock Bonds 1124.

Against the Railroad Stock Bonds 309.

Willow Springs Twp. For the Railroad Stock Bonds 5

Against " " " " 224.

whereupon the Board determined as follows.

That a majority of the whole number of qualified Electors of
Palmyra Township voting at said election, having voted in favor
declare it carried, and that a majority in Willow Springs
having voted against the proposition, declare it lost.
