White County Clerk of the County of Douglas in the State of Kansas under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Statute of the State of Kansas as such County Clerk, and under and by virtue of an order of the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas in the State of Kansas in that behalf made on the 2nd day of July 1886 the said Board of County Commissioners being then and there duly convened which said order is in the words and figures following to wit:

Board of County Commissioners met as required by law as a Board of Commissioners at 10 o'clock A.M. of said day for the purpose of canvassing the votes of a special election by them heretofore ordered to be held on the 29th day of June A.D. 1886 submitting to the qualified electors of Palmyra Township in said County the propositions for said township to subscribe thirty five thousand dollars to the Capital Stock of and to take thirty five thousand dollars in the Capital Stock of the Kansas, Colorado and Texas Railroad Company and issue the Bonds of said Palmyra township to the amount of thirty five thousand dollars in payment for said stock so taken to the Kansas, Colorado & Texas Railroad Company to aid in the construction of the line of Railroad which said Railroad Company proposes to construct from Kansas City in the State of Missouri into and through said township.

Burck Nor Draper chairman, John Walton and J. E. McCoy members of said Board of Commissioners and J. S. White County Clerk. The Board, after having, according to law duly canvassed the votes of said special election and caused an abstract of the same to be made on Pages 4 & 5 of record "A" of abstracts of votes cast, do find as a result of said canvass that there were cast in said Palmyra township at said election, "For the Railroad Stock and Bonds of the Kansas, Colorado and Texas Railroad Company Four hundred and twenty four (424) votes, and that there were cast in said Palmyra township at said election against the Railroad Stock and Bonds of the Kansas, Colorado and Texas Railroad Company Three hundred & nine (309) votes and a majority of the whole number of qualified electors of said township voting at said election having voted in favor of said Railroad stock and Bonds, the said Board of Commissioners do find and declare the proposition for said
