

In the Matter of }
 Road petitioned for by }
 E. S. Macey and others }

On the 12th day of January, A.D. 1887, a petition for a road signed by E. S. Macey and 13 others, was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas, praying for a change in road described as follows.

Beginning in the center of the County road leading South from Bloomington near the center line dividing the South West quarter, Sec. 25. S. 13 R. 18, running North South some two rods South of L. Jensen's house in the center of the road as now located. Thence South on said line or as near as practicable to the center line dividing the North West quarter of Sec. 25. S. 13 R. 18, running North South thence intersecting the County road as now located on said line South of Rock creek.

Said petition was accompanied with bond as required by law signed by E. S. Macey as principal and L. Jensen and Louis Higer as sureties in the penal sum of all costs and expenses. Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with, it was ordered that H. A. Finley, Geo. Richardson and E. L. Saylor be appointed viewers of the said change to be made in said road and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning on the day named in their notice, and proceed to view and make such change according to law, giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to this Board.
