

Petition for Herd Law
in Makarusa Sp. and Order of
the Board thereof

On the 5th day of January ad 1887 a petition signed by Samuel Riggs, A.D. Whitman, J.W. Shepherd and 362 others, qualified electors of Makarusa Township was filed and presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas at our regular January Session ad 1887, praying for an order "That all persons owning horses, mules, cattle, and swine shall keep them confined and restrained from running at large at any time of the day or night and at all seasons of the year in said Township of Makarusa."

Now, therefore, we the Board of County Commissioners in accordance with the law and in conformity with the said petition make this order:

That all persons owning domestic animals to wit:

Horses, cattle, mules and swine shall keep them confined and restrained from running at large at any time of the day or night and at all seasons of the year in said Makarusa Township. See Chapter 159, Sec. 2, Session Laws 1886 for penalty for violation of this order. - this order to take effect and be in force on and after March 1, ad 1887.

We have caused this our order to be entered upon the record of our proceedings and a certified copy thereof to be published in the Lawrence Weekly Journal for three weeks.

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On the 27th day of December ad 1886 a petition signed by Wm. H. Carey, Samuel Bergau, E. Zimmerman and 72 others, qualified electors of Grant Township was filed and presented to the Board of County Commissioners at our regular January Session ad 1887, praying for an order, "That all persons owning domestic animals to wit: Cows, horses, neat cattle, mules, colts and horses and cattle of every kind and description, shall keep such stock confined and from running at large at any time in said Township of Grant Douglas County Kansas. Now, therefore, we the Board of County Commissioners in accordance with the law and in conformity with the said petition make this order:

That all persons owning domestic animals to wit, Cows, horses, neat cattle, mules, colts, and horses and cattle of every kind and description shall keep such stock restrained from running at large at any time, in said Township of Grant Douglas County Kansas. See Chapter 159 Sec. 2. Session Laws 1886 for Penalty for violation of this order.
