

Laurens News April 23. 1887.

The Board of County Commissioners met in Special Session pursuant to adjournment at the office of the County Clerk.

There were present Commissioners John Walton Chairman, A. Draper and John E. McCoy, and Joel S. White County Clerk.

The Board decided to meet on Tuesday May 3. 1887 on the line of the Mr. Ritzman ditch, and on Friday May 6. at the line of the Mr. Cunningham ditch.

Read Law Petition, Recepture Prop.
and Order of the Board thereon }

On the 23rd day of April ad 1887 a Petition signed by J. H. Bonebrake, E. M. Huffman, James A. Davidson and one hundred and sixty four (164) others, qualified electors of Recepture township was filed and presented to the Board of County Commissioners then in Special Session, praying for an order that all persons owning horses, mules, cattle and swine shall keep them confined and restrained from running at large, at any time of the day or night, and at all seasons of the year in said Recepture township.

Wherefore, we the Board of County Commissioners, in accordance with the law and in conformity to the said petition, make this order.

That all persons owning domestic animals to wit: horses, cattle, mules and swine shall keep them confined and restrained from running at large at any time of the day or night and at all seasons of the year in said Recepture township.

(See Chapter 159, Sec. 2, Session Law 1886 for penalty for violation of this order)

This order to take effect and be in force on and after May 26. ad 1887.

We have caused this our order, to be entered upon the records of our proceedings and a certified copy thereof to be published ^{for three weeks} in the Laurens Tribune, a weekly newspaper published in the City of Laurens.
