

Lecompton Kansas Friday May 10, 1857.

The Board of County Commissioners and ex-officio Board of Commissioners, met at the Office of the County Clerk.

There were present Commissioners John Miller, Wm Draper and J. Ellery, and County Clerk J. S. White.

Results of Special Election

The Board proceeded to open and canvass the vote of the Special election held in Millers Spring Township May 10, 1857. and determined as follows for the subscription of stock and issue of bonds to the Missouri Kansas & South Western railway Company, one hundred & twenty two votes 122.

Against the subscription of stock and issue of bonds to the Missouri, Kansas and South Western Railway Company, one hundred and forty six votes 146. Majority against said subscription and issue of bonds to said Railway Company County four (24.)

The Board then proceeded to open and canvass the election returns of the Special election held and held in Marion township on the tenth day of May A.D. 1857. but finding an omission in the journal of the judges of said election in that while each of the judges had subscribed, it does not appear that they were sworn in. Whereupon the Board of Commissioners adjourned until tomorrow Saturday May 11, 1857.
