The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas and State of Kansas met at the Office of the County Clerk of said County in the Court House in the City of Lawrence in the County of Douglas Kansas on the 11th day of May A.D. 1887 at 6 O'clock P.M. of said day for the purpose of canvassing the election returns hereinafter named and pursuant to Law

J. S. White County Clerk of said Douglas County Kansas.

Silas Carvins a Justice of the Peace of Marion Township appeared before the Board and asked permission to correct an omission to sign the jurat on Poll books of said election, and filed the following affidavit:

Silas Carvins of Marion Township in the County of Douglas being first duly sworn deposes and swears, that he did on the 10th day of May at the place of holding a special election in Marion Township administer the Oath of Office to two of the Judges and the Clerks of said Special election, prior to their entering upon the discharge of their duties, and that Albert Long J.P. administered the oath to me.

Therefore said request was granted, and the said Board and said County Clerk promised to canvass the election returns which had been duly made and returned and filed in said County Clerk's Office of the votes cast at a special election had and held in the Township of Marion in said Douglas County Kansas on the 10th day of May A.D. 1887 for the purpose of voting upon the question and proposition of subscribing for and on behalf and in the name of said Marion Township in said Douglas County Kansas to and for one thousand and fifty shares of one hundred dollars each of the Capital Stock of the Missouri, Kansas and Southwestern Railway Company and in payment thereof to issue and deliver to said Railway Company. Thirty of the Bonds of said Marion Township of the denomination of Five hundred dollars each and which question and proposition had been duly submitted to the qualified electors of said Marion Township for their acceptance or rejection by an order of said Board of County Commissioners duly made and entered of record on the 2nd day of April A.D. 1887 in Journal F of the orders and proceedings of said Board at pages one to five inclusive.
