

And said returns being duly special examined and compared said Board of County Commissioners duly find and determine and ascertain that there were cast at said Special Election in said Marion Township on said 10th day of May AD 1887. One hundred and fifty seven votes (157) for the subscription of stock and issue of Bonds to the Missouri, Kansas, and South-western Railway Company and one hundred and forty votes (140) 'against the subscription of stock and issue of Bonds to the Missouri, Kansas and South-western Railway Company' and that at said Special Election in said Marion Township on said 10th day of May AD 1887, a majority of seventeen votes of all the votes cast were in favor of and for said proposition and that said proposition was duly adopted and carried by a majority of seventeen votes of all the votes cast at said Special Election.

Wherefore, we the ^{undersigned} Board of County Commissioners and Board of Assessors of Douglas County and State of Kansas that the above abstract contains and exhibits a true statement of the votes cast at said Special Election held in said Marion Township in said Douglas County Kansas, on said 10th day of May AD 1887, and we do hereby further certify and declare that the said question and proposition was duly adopted and carried in said Marion Township by a majority of seventeen (17) votes of all the votes cast at said Special Election so duly had in said Marion Township in said Douglas County and State of Kansas on said 10th day of May AD 1887.
