

Lawrence House Wed. July 6. 1887

Board of County Commissioners met at the Office of the County Clerk pursuant to adjournment.

On the 6th day of July AD 1887 a petition signed by
Leland R. Reynolds Mr. Rob. John Black and 350 other qualified
electors of Palmyra Township was filed and presented to the Board
of County Commissioners praying for an order "that all persons
owning domestic animals, to wit: Horses, mules, cows, neat cattle and
stock of every kind and description, shall keep them confined and ^{restrained} from
running at large at any time of the day or night and at all seasons
of the year in said Palmyra Township Douglas County, Kansas.

Wherefore, we the Board of County Commissioners in
accordance with law and in conformity to the said petition, make
this order. That all persons owning domestic animals to wit:

Order. Horses, cows, neat cattle and stock of every kind and description shall
keep the same confined and restrained from running at large at
any time of the day or night and at all seasons of the year, in
said Palmyra Township Douglas County, Kansas.

(See Chap. 109 sec. 2. sec. laws 1886 for penalty for violation of this order.)

This order to take effect and be in force now and after the 15th day of August
AD 1887.

We have caused this our order to be entered upon the
records of our proceedings and a certified copy thereof to be published
in the weekly Journal of Lawrence House for three weeks.
