

Lawrence Kansas. Wednesday July 13, 1887.

The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment at the Office of the County Clerk.

Present Commissioners John Walton Chairman, Mr. Draper and J. E. Long and J. S. White.

In the Matter of a Road }
petitioned for by F. E. Reed. }

On the 13th day of July A.D. 1887 a road petition signed by F. E. Reed and 17 others, was filed and presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, praying for the location of a certain road described as follows to wit:

Beginning at the S.W. Cor. of Sec. 1, 213, R. 19, E. thence East 1/2 mile to West Corner of the N.E. 1/4 of Sec. 1, thence East about 69 rods to the west line of the University grounds, thence South 40 rods to the S.W. Corner of the University grounds thence East to range line between Ranges 19 and 20 East.

Said petition was accompanied with bond, as required by law, signed by F. E. Reed as principal and J. R. Cunningham & J. Johnson as sureties in the sum of all expenses and costs accruing on the view.

Whereupon, said bond was approved by the Board, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with it was ordered - that J. H. Whedon, Albert E. Smith and C. R. Gould be appointed viewers of the proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning in Makarusa Township, on the day designated in their notices, and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law, giving to all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to the Board of County Commissioners.

Transferred.

It was ordered by the Board that the Treasurer transfer the balance of the County Sinking fund to the County General fund for temporary expense and replace the amount back into the interest fund - without further orders from the Board.
