On the 19th day of November AD 1887 a petition signed by A. C. Wilson, James Fitzpatrick D. M. Pierson and 111 others, qualified electors of Kauwaka Township, was filed and presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas at our regular January session AD 1888 praying for an order, that all persons owning horses, mules, cattle and swine shall keep them confined and ^{restrained} from running at large at any time of the day or night and at all seasons of the year in said Township of Kauwaka.

Now therefore, we the Board of County Commissioners in accordance with the law and in conformity with the said petition, make this order.

That all persons owning domestic animals to wit: horses, cattle, mules, sheep and swine, shall keep them confined and restrained from running at large, at any time of the day or night and at all seasons of the year, in said Kauwaka Township, (see Chapter 159, Sec. 2, Session Laws 1886 for penalty for violation of this order.)

This order to take effect and be in force on and after the 15th day of February AD 1888.

We have caused this our order to be entered upon the records of our proceedings and a certified copy thereof to be published in the Lawrence Gazette, for three consecutive
