 Willow Springs Sp. 3

On the 11th day of December 1887, a petition signed by
 N. C. Price, J. B. Stump, Chas. W. Seebor and 113 others, qualified electors
 of Willow Spring Township was filed and presented to the Board of
 County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas at our regular
 January Session A.D. 1888. Praying for an order, that all persons owning
 Horses, Mules, Cattle and Swine shall keep them confined and restrained
 from running at large at any time of the day or night and at all
 seasons of the year in said Township of Willow Springs.

That therefore we the Board of County Commissioners in
 accordance with the law and in conformity with the said petition, make
 this order.

That all persons owning domestic animals to wit:
 Horses, Cattle mules, Sheep and Swine shall keep them confined and restrained
 from running at large at any time of the day or night and at all
 seasons of the year in said Willow Springs Township (see Chapter
 159 Sec. 7 Session Laws 1886 for penalty for violations of this order)

This order to take effect and be in force on and after the
 15th day of February A.D. 1888.

We have caused this our order to be entered
 upon the records of our proceedings and a certified copy thereof to
 be published in Lawrence Weekly Tribune for three weeks.
