

Douglas County Kansas, praying for the Location of a certain Road as follows.

Beginning in (vacated portion of Leecompton) at the middle of Born St. where it crosses fourth St. ^{and} running east on middle of said vacated fourth St. 1965 ft. to the middle of (vacated) Jones St. Thence South along center of Jones St. 1532. feet to the middle of Sixth St.

Said petition was accompanied with a bond signed by W. H. Cardwell as principal, A. Frank Kerns ^{and} F. B. Hill as sureties in the amount of all costs ^{and} expenses accruing on the View, Survey, ^{and} laying out of said road.

Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board, ^{and} it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with, It was "Ordered" that William Hacer, Martin Sedgwick ^{and} R. D. Richards be appointed viewers of said proposed road. ^{and} that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning in Leecompton Township on the day designated in their notice, ^{and} proceed to View ^{and} lay out said road according to law, giving to all parties a hearing ^{and} make due report of their proceedings to the County Board.

Appointment of W. W. Fisher

The Board appointed W. W. Fisher Trustee of Palmyra Township as the proper person to superintend the burial of Honorably discharged deceased Soldiers ^{and} Sailors in said Township.
