The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment at the office of the County Clerk.

Road. Petition of
Isaac Plura }

In the matter of the aforesaid road petition the County Surveyor, Jno. M. Walker, reports that the view heretofore appointed on said road did not meet him on the day designated by the County Clerk for view, nor upon the day following, whereupon the Board appointed C.F. Dolbe.

Road. Petition of
J.P. Bolton }

On the first day of April A.D. 1890. a road petition signed by J.P. Bolton and 14 others was filed and this day presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas, praying for the location of a road in Palmyra Township, in said County as follows.

Beginning at the Cr. & Corner of the North West $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 27. T. 14. R. 20. thence running due north on section line between sections 27 and 28. (160.) One hundred and sixty rods to the Cr. & N. corner of the Cr. & N. $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 27.

Said petition was accompanied with a bond signed by J.P. Bolton as principal. Wm. F. Gill and David Harshburger as sureties in the amount of all costs and expenses accruing on the view, survey, and laying out of said road, in case the prayer of said petitioners shall not be granted, or the proceedings had in pursuance thereof shall not be finally confirmed and established.

Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board and in appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with, it was Ordered that R.C. McCormore, R. N. Doolittle and L. A. Runsey be appointed as view of the proposed road, and that they meet in conjunction with the County surveyor at the place of beginning in Palmyra Township on the day designated in their notice, and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law giving all parties a hearing, and make due report of their
