

Lawrence Kansas June 11th 1890.

The County Board of Equalization met at the office of the County Clerk

and the County Clerk being present.
All the members ^{present} and the County Clerk being present.

The Board took up and considered the Petition of tax payers, as presented from Wakarusa Township, praying for a reduction of the Assessment of said township from an average value of \$11.87 "as agreed basis" per acre, by the assessors, to an average value of \$10.00 per acre.

A protest against said petition was filed by tax payers of Palmyra Township, and also Resolutions of the Vinland Farmers Alliance.

The following township assessors were present and protested against the granting of the aforesaid petition, alleging that it would work an injustice to the tax payers of their respective townships.
